<u>Summary</u>

On the back of October, Black History Month UK, I'm of the notion that to not be tokenistic, we

shouldn't be designating months, weeks or days to commemorate things.

For example:

- Black History Month
- Mental Health Day
- LGBT History Month

And more.

In this train of thought, I will be continuing the events throughout the year, looking at Black history – from film nights to guest speakers. So, initiatives like Black History need to be done for a year consistently to yield any sort of results.

After going through the registers for everyone of my events between Welcome Week and 1st November, close to 400 people have been impacted by my events and just over 300 are individuals.

As of the 6th November, looking at just Black History (Month), that number sits at 341 – including students, staff and members of the public. Twenty-seven individual events across thirty-two days, with performance-based events gaining people in mass (peaking at 40 on the 1st November), whilst the more education-based events gathered small groups, but attendees left feeling challenged.

International and EU students found the events enjoyable and so did White Home students.

However, I continue to find challenges in penetrating the Black British demographic.
